

# 2025 Youth Advocate Award Nominations due by Friday, January 10, 2025

#### What is the Youth Advocate Award?

The Youth Advocate Award is presented to a young person who has worked diligently over the past year as an advocate, initiating positive change for themselves, their peers, their communities, or statewide. Youth advocate efforts and examples may include, but are not limited to:

- creating public awareness
- engaging in creative efforts and activities
- · demonstrating strong youth leadership
- · working collaboratively to improve the lives of others
- supporting programs and/or policies that have benefited children and families

### Who is eligible to receive this award?

- Anyone can submit a nomination; you may nominate yourself
- Teachers, parents, mentors, students and others are encouraged to submit a nomination for a youth advocate that inspires them
- Nominees must be under 18 years of age or in school (K-12) at the time of their nomination
- Nominees should be actively involved in advocacy at the local or state level that have improved the lives
  of children, youth, and families

### When will you announce the 2025 Youth Advocate Award recipient?

The 2025 recipient will be honored on **Monday, April 14, 2025**. The public announcement will take place during our annual Children's Week Florida™ Advocacy Dinner and Awards Ceremony. The recipient will be invited to take part in various activities and speaking engagements throughout next year's Children's Week Florida™ events in Tallahassee, Florida.

## Who selects the recipient?

- Nominations are reviewed by the Florida After School, Inc. Board of Directors and the Children's Week Florida™ Advocacy Awards Committee, consisting of former award winners, community partners, and advocates.
- Nominees will have the option to submit a 2-minute video or a 500-word personal statement to accompany
  their nomination. Nominees may use this opportunity to provide any additional information not shared by
  the nominator.
