### Award Description:

Each year, Children's Week Florida™ presents the **Lawton and Rhea Chiles Advocacy Award** to a Floridian who has dedicated an extensive amount of time working to advocate for statewide issues affecting the status and well-being of children, youth, and families, and who has engaged others to promote policies and/or programs benefiting them.

This awardee may also have a record of service in either a professional or voluntary capacity, or both. This year's recipient will be honored on Monday, January 31, 2021 during the Children's Week Florida™ Advocacy Reception and Awards Ceremony. They will also be invited to participate in the Children's Week Florida™ Teen Town Hall on Tuesday, February 1, 2022 helping inspire young minds and motivate the next generation of advocates.

### Eligibility Criteria:

- Anyone can submit a nomination; you may nominate yourself.
- Nominees must have demonstrated a commitment to advocating for public policies that improve the lives of Florida's children, youth, and their families.
- Nominees must represent the highest standards of professionalism and be well recognized as a leader in Florida's efforts to address children, youth, and family issues.

### Required Nomination Package Components:

1. **Nomination Form** – Must complete all fields of the form and sign.
2. **Narrative Summary & Personal Statement** – Provide a narrative summary or personal statement that describes the nominee's contributions and/or commitment to serving children, youth, and families (*total 750-word maximum*).
3. **Photo** – Include a photo of nominee in jpeg or png format.

### Additional Information:

- All nominations will be reviewed by the Children's Week Florida™ Advocacy Awards Committee, a volunteer peer review group consisting of previous award winners and other advocates.
